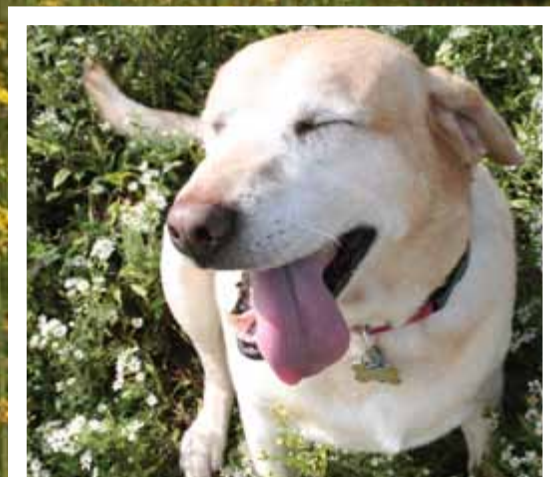

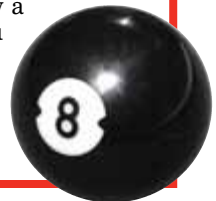

# Ashland County Park District Offerings: A great alternative for summer fun!

With summer in full swing, it's time to put down the remote control and put on some walking shoes. The Ashland County Park District – made up of 13 parks - offers no shortage of variety for those who enjoy a range of activities in the out-of-doors.

"We believe the outside provides opportunities to get away from ... the worries of life," said Tom Kruse, Ashland County Park District Commissioner, who adds that the goals of the parks' system includes encouraging people to get out on the trails in a safe environment. The district is focused on offering great walking trails and providing places for kids to get outside, he explained.



Whether it's marveling at the carnivorous bladderwort at Black Fork Bottoms, trying to spot the 70-plus species of birds at Byers Woods, taking a wildflower walk through Pine Hill or strolling the boardwalk through the Audubon Wetlands, there is enough to keep even the pickiest kids from becoming bored.

The Park District boasts a collection of 13 parks, including three parks which had not opened as of press time:

- Black Fork Bottoms - Byers Woods - Cooke Park - Cool Springs - Freer Field - Riverwalk - Audubon Wetlands - Gilliom Cherp - Hopkins Landing - Pine Hill (including Crall Woods and Sauer's Farm) - *There are three yet-to-be-opened parks:* Esbenshade Wetlands, Hurdle Waterfowl Preserve and Sprinkles Serenity.

Visitors can take in the parks at their leisure, or enjoy them through organized programs, such as Bird Walks offered by the Greater Mohican Audubon Society at Byers Woods. Be sure to check out the park district's website for the rules and guidelines regarding geocaching in the district's parks. Friends of the Ashland County Parks also put on events with children in mind offering craft and woodland activities, as well as educational booths, throughout the year at various locations.

### Android Release History

In September 2008 version 1.0 was release, since its original release Android has realized a number of updates typically fix bugs and add new features. Generally, each version is developed under a code name based on a desert item. The code names are in alphabetical order.

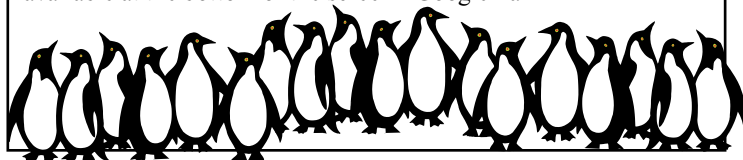
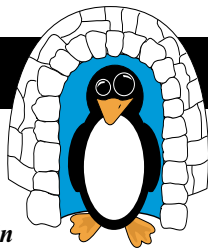

## Building Trust – The 21st Century Way

Who do you trust? If you're like most people, the list of people whose opinions you value is probably pretty small. As a business owner, you obviously cannot directly control people's recommendations or opinions that they post online. The best way to get positive word-of-mouth and good opinions posted about you online will never change – provide the service or product that you promised and make sure your customer is satisfied. Taking good care of your customer is a sure-fire way to ensure they tell all their friends about your business. But there are steps you can take to develop trust and build relationships.

### What tools can a savvy business owner use to build trust online?

**1) A blog.** Writing a blog is a great way to let your personality shine online and let people see there is a real person behind your business. ## The Recipe Place

### Dad's Breakfast Pizza

#### Ingredients

- cooking spray
- 1 pound bacon, chopped
- 1 teaspoon butter
- 12 eggs
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1/2 green bell pepper, chopped
- 2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese
- 2 (12 ounce) cans refrigerated biscuits (10 biscuits per can)



#### Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Lightly spray a 9x12-inch baking sheet with cooking spray. Cook the bacon in a large skillet over medium heat, until the bacon is browned and crisp, about 10 minutes.

Open up the cans of biscuits, and arrange onto the prepared baking sheet so they touch. Press the biscuit dough down to seal them together into a crust that covers the baking sheet. Bake in the preheated oven until the crust is slightly cooked and very lightly browned, about 5 minutes. Do not overbake. Remove from oven. Melt the butter in skillet over medium heat then scramble the eggs just until set, but still moist, 3 to 4 minutes. Arrange the lightly scrambled eggs on the semi-baked biscuit crust. Top with the cooked bacon, onion, and green pepper; spread the Cheddar cheese all over the pizza. Season to taste with salt and black pepper.

Return to oven, and bake on the top rack until the cheese is melted and bubbling and has begun to brown, about 10 more minutes.

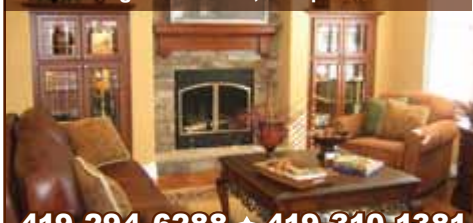
