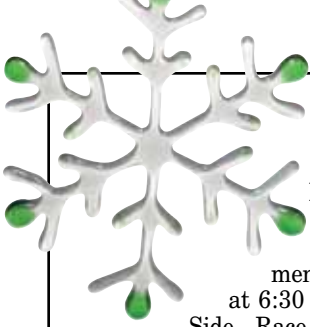

**The Health Benefits of Chocolate**

In doing the research for this article, I came across many references about why it is healthy for your heart... particularly the dark chocolate because of the number of flavonoids that it contains. Flavonoids help protect plants from environmental toxins and help repair damage. But really, what are flavonoids? Flavonoids are most commonly known for their antioxidant activity.

Consumers and food manufacturers have recently become interested in flavonoids for their possible medicinal properties, especially their role in inhibiting cancer or cardiovascular disease. Dark chocolate contains a large number of antioxidants - nearly 8 times the number found in strawberries! Flavonoids also help relax blood pressure through the production of nitric oxide, and balance certain hormones in the body.

Studies have shown that consuming a small bar of dark chocolate everyday can reduce blood pressure in individuals with high blood pressure. It can also lower Cholesterol. Dark chocolate has been shown to reduce LDL cholesterol (the bad cholesterol) by up to 10 %.

Chocolate also holds benefits apart from protecting your heart:

- it tastes good
- it stimulates endorphin production (a feeling of pleasure)
- it contains serotonin, which acts as an anti-depressant
- it contains theobromine, caffeine and other stimulants

"Flavonoids help protect plants by shielding them from environmental toxins and helping repair damage. When we consume plant-based foods rich in flavonoids, it appears that we also benefit from this "antioxidant" power. Antioxidants are believed to help the body's cells resist damage caused by free radicals that are formed by normal bodily processes such as breathing and from environmental contaminants like cigarette smoke. When the body lacks adequate levels of antioxidants, damage from free radicals occurs and leads to increases in LDL ("bad")-cholesterol oxidation (oxidized LDL-cholesterol hurts the arteries) and plaque formation on the walls of the arteries." - To read more of the article go online to:

# Household Uses for Vinegar

## Pretty Puppy

Give your dog a gleaming coat by spraying or rubbing with a solution of 1 cup white distilled vinegar to 1 quart water. As a bonus, you save the cost of an expensive shine product used on show animals.

## Kill Fleas

Kill fleas by adding a little white distilled vinegar to your dog or cat's drinking water. also deters ants, Discourage ants by spraying undiluted white distilled vinegar outside doorways and windowsills, around appliances and wherever you find the pests coming in.

## Clean your window blinds

You can make the job of cleaning mini-blinds or venetians considerably less torturous by giving them "the white glove treatment." Just put on a white cotton glove — the kind sold for gardening is perfect — and moisten the fingers in a solution made of equal parts white vinegar and hot tap water. Now simply slide your fingers across both sides of each slat. Use a container of clean water to periodically wash off the glove.

## Remove mineral deposits

Remove mineral deposits from coffee makers with white distilled vinegar. Fill the water reservoir with 1 cup or more of white distilled vinegar and run it through a whole cycle. Run it once or twice more with plain water to rinse clean.

The Richland County Children's Auxiliary members are committed to improving the lives of local children. They do this by identifying kids that need more success and then dressing them appropriately for school! This is such an important part of education – to fit in, to have quality clothing and basic essentials.

The Richland County Children's Auxiliary has been in existence for the past 15 years with largely the same core group of dedicated members donating their time to serve the children of Richland County. **The New Store has been open for the past 5 years. They dress 750 children each year from September – April, kindergarten through eighth grade.** The children they serve are referred by their school principal based on need.

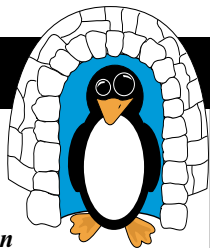

- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 1 cup white sugar
- 1/2 cup milk
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 (9 inch) unbaked pie crust

#### To Garnish:

Dollop of whipped cream



#### Directions

Boil sweet potato whole in skin for 40 to 50 minutes, or until done. Run cold water over the sweet potato, and remove the skin.

Break apart sweet potato in a bowl. Add butter, and mix well with mixer. Stir in sugar, milk, eggs, nutmeg, cinnamon and vanilla. Beat on medium speed until mixture is smooth. Pour filling into an unbaked pie crust.

Bake at 350 degrees for 55 to 60 minutes, or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Pie will puff up like a souffle, and then will sink down as it cools.

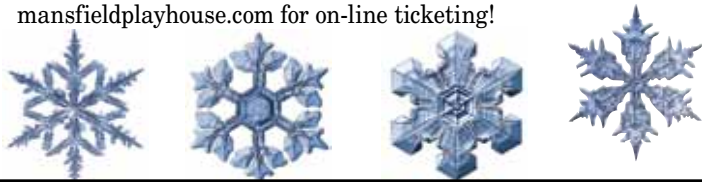

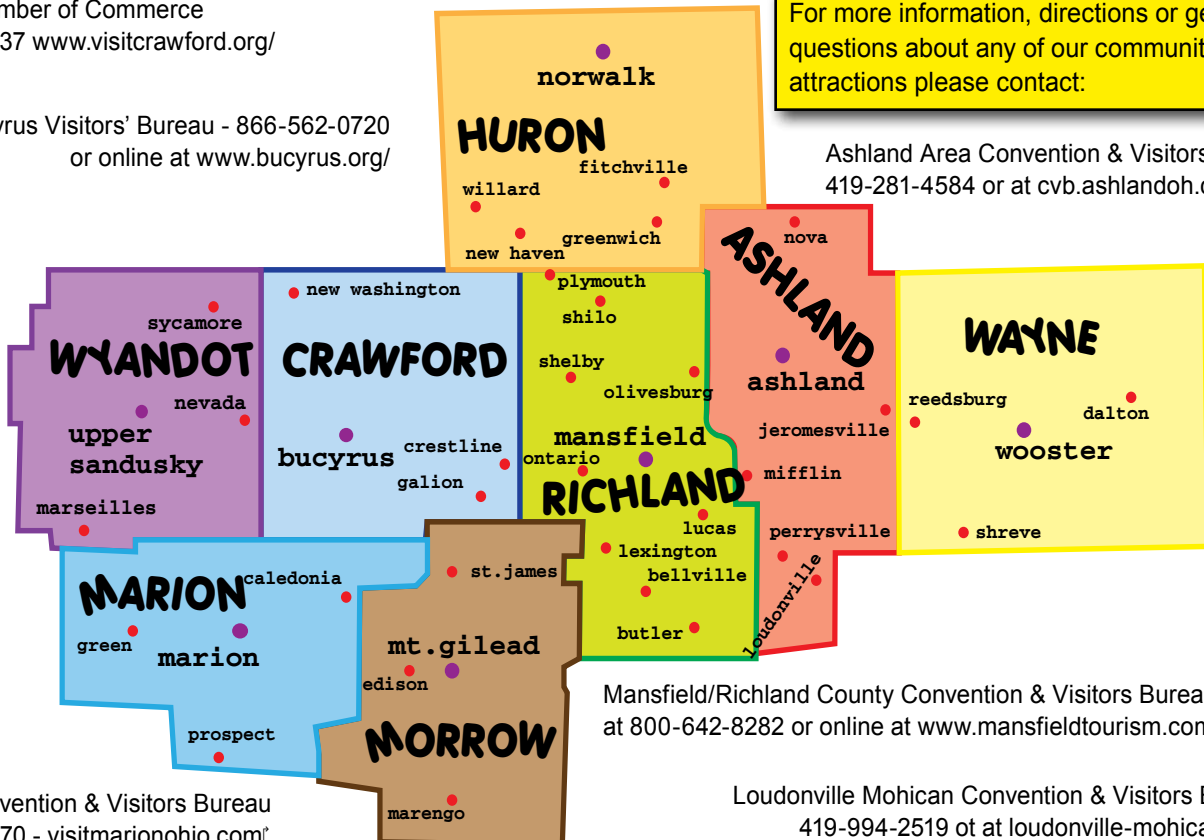
